The Mekong Region



Objectives


Develop an understanding of regional dynamics relating to government policy, agribusiness investment opportunities and livelihoods of smallholders through:

- Review and collate data cattle and beef industries in the region
- ✓Investigate selected trans-boundary cattle and beef trade flows
- ✓ Develop Spatial Price Equilibrium model of the cattle and beef industries in the region

Approach


- Main concentration:
 - Vietnam (experiencing rapid increases in demand and commercialisation of the sector) and
 - Myanmar (a key live cattle supply area, currently transitioning away from a draft orientation to cattle production orientation in the Central Dry Zone)
- Detailed analyses of domestic beef industries using primary data and official and unofficial data including a critical examination of statistical issues;
- Analysis of both formal and informal trade flows, networks and barriers to trade in the region; and
- Spatial Price Equilibrium model of the cattle and beef industries in the region

Cattle numbers


Cattle numbers (million head)



Comments:

• Cattle number gradually decreased for China, Thailand & Vietnam since 2008


Cattle meat production



Comments:

- Generally, beef production steadily increased (while cattle numbers stagnated)
- This suggests an indication of productivity, including slaughter rates & carcass weights


Beef consumption




Comments:

- Doubling of beef consumption in China and Vietnam between 2000 & 2013 (not taking into account unofficial beef imports)
- Consumption growth rate is higher than production data, particularly for China and Vietnam

Four main value chains



"Northern" Value Chain



250,000 cattle/ year

- 225,000 to China
- 25,000 to Vietnam







"Southern" Value Chain










"Australian" Value Chain







"Indian" Buffalo Value Chain




Implications

- Highly Interlinked Region
- Large movements of cattle and beef/buffalo meat over long distances
- Cross-border price differentials and border restrictions → informal trade between Myanmar /Thailand, and Myanmar and China
- The economy opening & changes in slaughter and live export policy → Myanmar significant player in the Mekong region
- Implications for policy, industry & smallholders
