


About IDH










Supply chain of commodities: e.g. palm oil














General issues of sourcing areas (supply sheds) & smallholders

At PISAgro level:


- Aligning w/ the Government's priorities on food sovereignty & globally traded commodities, while supporting farmers








Individual member: financing for replanting



- Innovative Financing for Smallholder Palm Oil Replanting in 4,610ha and a Landscape Model in Lalan sub-district, Musi Banyuasin district, South Sumatra province.
- Partners: The CPO
 Fund, Governor of South
 Sumatra, Bupati of Musi
 Banyuasin, Banks & IDHSustainable Trade
 Initiative.
- The CPO Fund provides
 50% of financing to cover replanting costs, while farmers & banks provide the rest












Landscape approach: beyond farms & concessions



Parcels of farms or concessions

Not contributing to shared issues/ challenges:

- Hydrological management
- Peat fires prevention
- Ecosystems/carrying capacity in a landscape
- Social dimension
- Smallholder productivity

- Incentivising concessions/farms (small to large) to collaborate and be integrated in a sustainable supply sheds/landscape
- Improving land use/spatial planning
- Legal reforms, organisations of SH











Forward: scale up & out

- 1. Enable shift to second phase of scale up, ie. helping ca 10 companies per crop to lead this next phase of scale up.
- 2. These companies should be able to efficiently provide oversight of, eg. several working groups active in this crop across multiple locations in Indonesia.
- 3. Exploring different models/ platforms of pre-competitive behavior
