Associate Professor Brown is a Principal Research Fellow at MCRI and holds honorary appointments as Principal Research Fellow and Associate Professor in the Department of General Practice and School of Population Health at the University of Melbourne. Her research interests include women's health and childbirth, maternal depression and intimate partner violence. Stephanie is particularly interested in methods for evaluating complex interventions of maternity, postnatal and primary care, and in the development of partnerships and participatory approaches in Indigenous health research.

Her group has strong collaborative relationships with international, interstate and local researchers, clinicians, policy makers, health service managers and Aboriginal community organisations. The many varied collaborators enrich the quality of the group's research program and provide important links for their engagement in health policy and practice.
