

Course Readings: enabling student discussion

Introduction

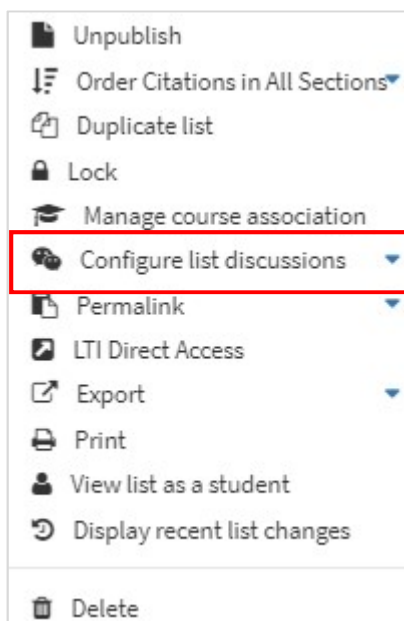
There is an option in Course Readings for students to post to a Discussion List. By default this option is turned off but it is able to be turned on for individual courses. Once it is enabled, students can submit discussion posts that are viewable by teaching staff and students in the course.

Procedure

1. Click on the ... icon at the top of the relevant Reading List



2. Open the **Configure list discussions** drop down



3. Select **Show student discussion thread**

4. Students will now see the **Student Discussion** option and will be able to add comments.
