Lynn is coordinator of level 2 Biochemistry and teaches first and second year science students and first to third year medical students. Her research interests are student assessment, feedback, and the role of facilitators in student support. She has been involved in redesigning the second year Biochemistry curriculum to make it more student-focused by introducing learning activities that cater for a variety of learning styles to ensure learning in context. - The Richard Pellew Prize for outstanding teaching to medical students in 2001
