



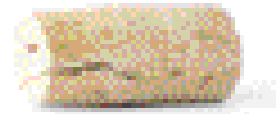

19th January



In 1907 Archie Fontanini created an irrigation dam on his property where Pemberton locals and tourists would come to swim, affectionately known as 'Fonty's Pool'. Today, under the direction of winemaker Ely Jarvis, the unique signature of Fonty's Pool is emerging as one of Western Australia's most distinctive wineries.

2nd February



Annie's Lane wines rely on regional and varietal expression and have been awarded with over 350 trophies and medals at wine shows in Australia and across the globe since the first release in 1996. The most successful of all the wines has been the super-premium Copper Trail Shiraz. The home of Annie's Lane is the heritage listed Quelltaler winery at the heart of Watervale, in the Clare Valley's south. Quelltaler is the region's oldest and most important winery, dating back to 1863.

16th February



Founded in 1974 in the original 19th Century Enterprise Brewery, Knappstein's trademark is 'Handcrafted wines that capture the essence of the Clare Valley.' A small winery, Knappstein produces world class wines that are outstanding expressions of their variety and the distinguished vineyards from where the fruit is sourced in the Clare Valley.

2nd March



The dream of Sinclair's Gully began back in 1997, when Sue and Sean Delaney purchased their twenty-six acre property in the Adelaide Hills and started to produce premium cool climate grapes and handcrafted wines. Mt Bera is located in the cool climate area of the Adelaide Hills, some 30km north east of Adelaide. The vineyard was planted in 1997 under the inspiration of Peter Hall and the culmination of his dream to return Mt. Bera to an economically viable property growing quality fruit.

16th March



The Bay of Fires range was born of a desire to make cool climate wines of classical structure, combining fruit intensity with refinement, complexity and persistence of flavour. The wines represent a pinnacle of Australian viticulture and winemaking endeavour and showcase the essence of Tasmania.

30th March



Elevated Clare Valley vineyards provide for a long, slow, ripening period, resulting in intense varietal fruit flavours. Grapes are invariably among the last in the Clare Valley to be picked. Vines are virtually dry-grown making for a vineyard that is extremely labour-intensive: this is in keeping with Penna Lane's philosophy that wine is made in the vineyard.
