

Are you pregnant?

Pregnant women who have a current concession card do not have to go on a waiting list to see a public dentist. You will be given the next available appointment.

Visiting a dentist or other oral health professional while pregnant is highly recommended. A regular check-up is an important routine to develop for you and your child.

Questions and Answers

Am I eligible to see a public dentist?

Yes, if:

- You have a Victorian Health Care or Pensioner Concession card, or
- You are a dependant of a concession card holder.

Will I go on a waiting list?

- No. If you are pregnant you will be given the next available appointment to assess your oral health needs.

Do I have to pay?

- If you are 18 years of age or over, a small fee applies.
- If you are 17 years of age or under, fees do not apply.
- Fees apply if you need dentures or specialist services.

Please discuss the fees that will apply to you when you make your appointment.
