Introduction

Health, Disability and Lifespan Development Research Group (HDLD) is designed to provide a focus for research in health psychology, disability and rehabilitation, health service delivery, and healthy development across the lifespan. It represents a coalescence of the School's previous Disabilities Research Unit directed by Dr Neil Kirby, and the Primary Mental Health Care Research Unit directed by Professor Helen Winefield and Professor Deborah Turnbull, with colleague School of Psychology researchers whose interests focus on human health and wellbeing through the lifespan, from birth to old age. These fields are linked by a common interest in the assessment and theoretical explanation of the determinants of individual well-being, both physical and psychosocial, how these are affected by age, gender, socioeconomic status and psychological variables, the evaluation of interventions to promote health and wellbeing, and the health policy implications of all.

Executive Summary

Over the past year HDLD has continued to build its membership within the university and without. University of Adelaide membership has come largely from School of Psychology but also from Commerce, Dentistry, General Practice, Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Pathology, Pharmacology, Psychiatry, and Public Health. Membership within the School of Psychology is made up of researchers, academics, higher degree research students, professional program and undergraduate students. This report lists the 2008 grants and publications of core academic members in Psychology. External membership interest has come from CNAHS-RAH, Cancer Council SA, CSIRO, DFEEST, DPC, SA Health, TRACsa and the private sector.

HDLD has hosted monthly seminars to inform and support members and to engage interest, participation and meaningful exchange with representatives from government agencies, community organisations and the private sector. HDLD is also disseminates information (via e-mail and exchange at monthly HDLD seminars) of relevant sources of funding and opportunities for career development.

Contextual Statement

This Report covers 2008 with appropriate references to ongoing and future activities.

The HDLD Convenor is Professor Helen Winefield. Mrs Susan Gravier was employed in June 2008 as Publicity Officer (part-time, casual, 2-3 hours per week). Her role is to build HDLD membership, develop links to relevant people and organisations outside of the university, publicise the monthly seminars, provide administrative support to the core academic members of the group, and maintain the HDLD website.

Since conception in October 2006, HDLD has worked to develop and maintain a cohesive, extensive membership, and to support member researchers. HDLD membership continues to grow monthly as interest and engagement in the research group develops via the varied monthly seminars.

HDLD aims to instigate and support a framework for new cross-disciplinary research teams. One which recently received seed funding from the Centre for Intergenerational Health will result in an ARC Linkage application early next year.
