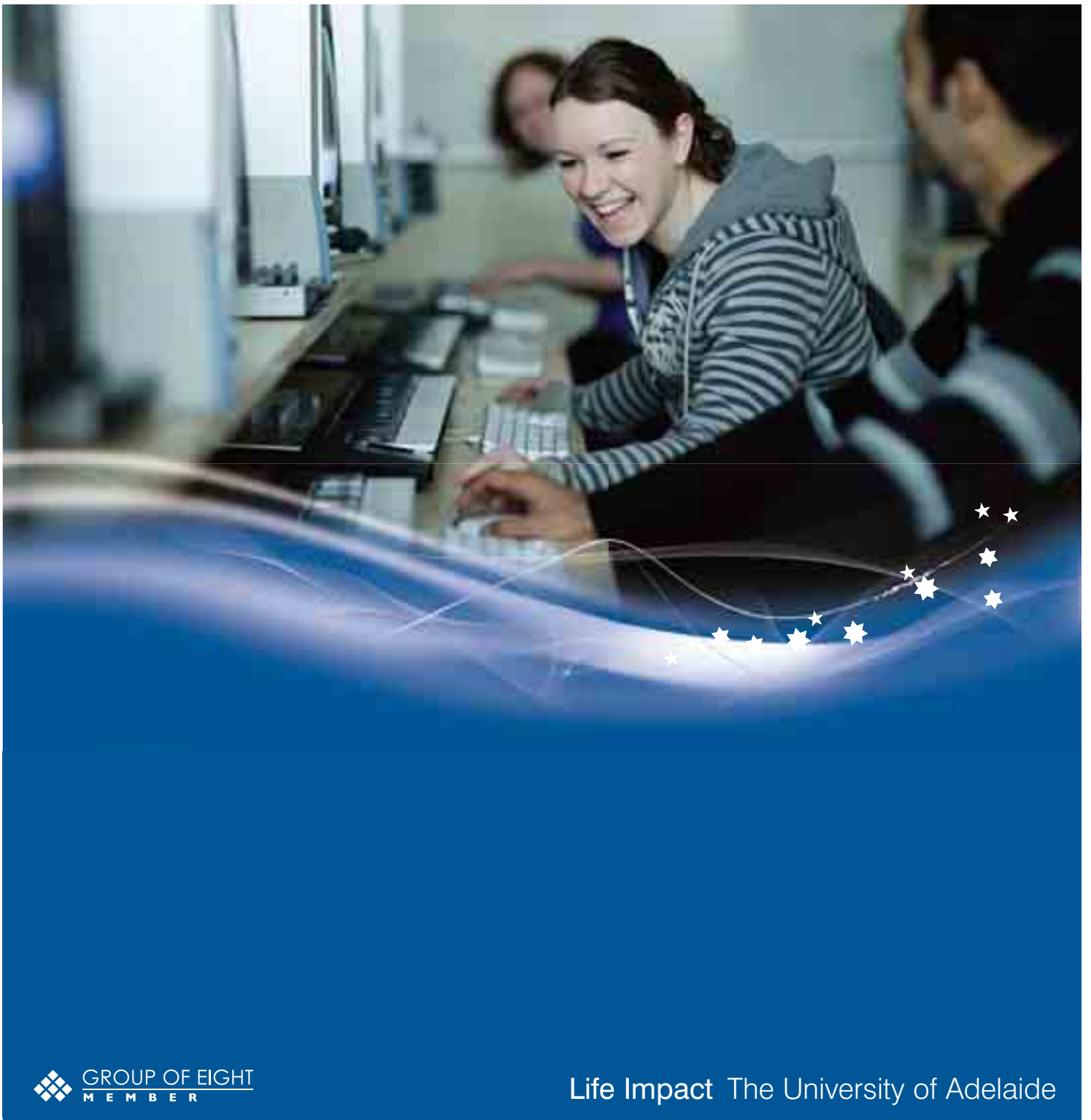

Undergraduate Scholarships

The University of Adelaide has a range of scholarships for undergraduate and honours students studying at the University. The University's scholarships website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships provides a comprehensive resource for both commencing and currently enrolled students with details about the University's scholarships and the wide variety of other scholarships that are offered by government, industry and not-for-profit organisations. This booklet contains a brief outline of some of the scholarships available.

Scholarships are listed under a number of categories, but it is strongly recommended that students look through the full range, as these are not mutually exclusive - for example, some students in financial need may also qualify for scholarships available to rural students.

Categories include scholarships for Commencing, Continuing, and Honours Students. As well there are scholarships for Students in Financial Need; Students from Rural, Regional or Remote Areas; and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students.

Applications

Scholarship application forms usually need to be completed, unless indicated otherwise, and these are available from the Scholarships website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships

The conditions for individual scholarships vary but recipients are generally required to enrol on a full time basis.

Applications for 2009 scholarships usually open early in 2009 and application forms are generally downloadable from the above website approximately 6 - 8 weeks before the closing date. Some scholarships may open prior to the end of 2008 so the website should be checked regularly.

Scholarships for Commencing Students

The University of Adelaide manages a number of scholarships, sponsored by the University, Commonwealth Government and other external agencies and private donors, which provide assistance for students about to start at University. A full listing of scholarships for commencing students, updated regularly, is available at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships

As well as a generous number of scholarships offered to students with outstanding results in year 12, scholarships are also available for students who have particular difficulties in meeting the costs of attending University who may have good (rather than outstanding) year 12 results.

The University of Adelaide South Australian Merit Scholarships

These University scholarships will be offered to all South Australian students who have demonstrated outstanding academic merit by obtaining a Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER) of 99.95 (excluding all bonus points).

They are available to Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who are offered a Commonwealth Supported Place via SATAC in an undergraduate bachelor degree program and are commencing post secondary studies for the first time in 2009.

The scholarships provide an allowance of \$10,000 to assist with education/living costs for the first year of a student's program. No formal application is necessary. The University will contact eligible students.

Adelaide Undergraduate Scholarships

Four prestigious Adelaide Undergraduate Scholarships will be offered to the most outstanding students drawn from those eligible for the South Australian Merit Scholarships and who have also made a significant contribution to their school and to the wider community. The scholarships provide an allowance of \$5000 per annum to assist with education/living costs for up to four years, and will also cover the student's Commonwealth contribution amounts for up to four years. Eligible students will be contacted by the University and invited to apply.

Andy Thomas Scholarship

The Andy Thomas Scholarship is offered each year to an outstanding student commencing aerospace, mechanical or mechatronic engineering in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

The Andy Thomas Scholarship is available to Australian citizens or permanent residents who have applied through SATAC for admission to the Bachelor of Engineering (Aerospace, Mechanical or Mechatronic) commencing in 2009 and who have not commenced a program at tertiary level previously (either university or TAFE).

The scholarship provides an allowance of \$5000 per annum to assist with education/living costs for up to four years, and will also cover the student's Commonwealth contribution amounts for up to four years. Eligible students will be contacted by the University and invited to apply.

The University of Adelaide Principals' Scholarships

One scholarship will be available for each school in South Australia, Northern Territory, Broken Hill and non-metropolitan Victoria, which has candidates completing their Year 12 studies at that school in 2008. The University will invite school principals to nominate candidates by Friday 28 November 2008.

These scholarships are available to students who have made a significant contribution to their school and to the wider community. Students must also obtain a TER of 90 or greater, after the addition of the University's Fairway bonus (if applicable).

Students must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who expect to qualify for their year 12 certificate at a nominated school in 2008.

They must have applied through SATAC for admission to a Commonwealth Supported Place in an undergraduate bachelor degree program at the University of Adelaide, and be commencing post secondary studies for the first time in 2009. The scholarship provides an allowance of \$5000 to assist with education/living costs for the first year of a student's program.

The South Australian Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure (DTEI) Scholarship

The scholarship, provided by the South Australian Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure, assists commencing students undertaking a bachelor program of study in the area of Civil Engineering at the University of Adelaide for the duration of their undergraduate program (usually four years, but up to a maximum of five years).

The scholarship is available to Australian citizens or permanent residents undertaking study as a Commonwealth supported student. The scholarship is valued at \$2,700 per year for a four year degree, or \$2,160 per year for a double degree or five year program of study.

The Stott Despoja Scholarship

This scholarship provides support to a financially disadvantaged, full-time, female student of academic merit who would not otherwise be able to attend university. The scholarship is for a first year student undertaking a Bachelor of Arts program at the University of Adelaide.

The scholarship will provide payment of the student's Commonwealth contribution amount for the first year of this program. The scholarship is available to Australian citizens or permanent residents undertaking study as a Commonwealth Supported student.

BHP Billiton Scholarships

Two scholarships are provided by BHP Billiton Olympic Dam Corporation Pty Ltd (BHP Billiton) to assist commencing students undertaking the Bachelor of Engineering (Mining) program at the University of Adelaide for the duration of their undergraduate program (up to a maximum of four years).

The scholarships are open to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia and undertaking study on a full time basis as a Commonwealth Supported student. The scholarships are valued at \$10,000 per annum.





Trevor Dillon Agronomic Roseworthy Study Scholarship

This scholarship has been established in memory of Trevor Dillon, a noted agronomist and graduate of Roseworthy College, to support a first year student undertaking a program of study in the field of Agriculture/Agronomy who is resident at Roseworthy Residential College. The scholarship will meet the student's full residential costs for the first year of their undergraduate program.

This scholarship is open to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who are enrolled as Commonwealth Supported students.

Scholarships for Students in Financial Need

The University of Adelaide offers a range of scholarships to support students whose financial circumstances make it difficult for them to undertake university study.

Adelaide Access Scholarships

The University of Adelaide will award a number of scholarships for students commencing undergraduate programs in 2009 who have not commenced a program at tertiary level previously (either university or TAFE) and who can demonstrate financial need.

Applicants must be Australian citizens, permanent residents, New Zealand citizens, or holders of a permanent humanitarian visa and belong to one or more of the following student groups:

- Indigenous Australians
- financial or social disadvantaged (low socio-economic status)
- from rural or isolated areas
- with a disability
- from non-English speaking backgrounds
- women in non-traditional areas of study.

To be eligible for these scholarships students must enrol on a full-time basis (unless there are special circumstances preventing this, such as disability). Recipients of the Adelaide Access Scholarship will receive \$2,000 per annum for the duration of their studies, up to a maximum of 4 years.

Commonwealth Scholarships

The Commonwealth government offers a significant number of scholarships each year for students studying at this University through the Commonwealth Scholarships scheme. The scholarships are to assist students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those from rural and regional areas, and Indigenous students, with costs associated with higher education.

Students must be Australian citizens or holders of Australian permanent humanitarian visa, and must enrol on a full-time basis (unless there are special circumstances preventing this, such as disability).

Special consideration will be given to Indigenous students.

As of 2009, SATAC will manage the application, assessment and offer process for Commonwealth and Adelaide Access Scholarships on behalf of the University of Adelaide. Students can apply online via the SATAC website: www.satac.edu.au

Applications open on 11 August 2008. Students should apply by 5 December 2008.

A range of other scholarships are also available for students in financial need and a selection is listed below.

Walter and Dorothy Duncan Trust

The Trust provides financial assistance with educational costs for students who have difficulty achieving equity of access to higher education, eg, those from low socio-economic backgrounds, isolated and rural areas, non-English speaking backgrounds, students with a disability, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, and women pursuing studies in fields under-represented by women.

Grant amounts vary depending on need. Demonstrated academic merit is also required.

Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Education Foundation of SA Roseworthy Scholarship

These scholarships have been established by the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Education Foundation of SA in support of the Roseworthy Campus and Student Fund to support two second-year students who are undertaking a program of study in the field

of Agriculture or Horticulture based at the Roseworthy Campus of the University of Adelaide.

These Scholarships are open to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who have been resident in South Australia for at least ten years and who are enrolled as Commonwealth Supported students. The Scholarships are valued at \$2,500 per annum for two years.

Scholarships for Students from Rural, Regional or Remote Areas

Students from rural, regional and remote areas of Australia should check the entries in the earlier section on scholarships for students in financial need.

A selection of scholarships is listed below but students should check the website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships for a more complete list.

Cowan Grants and Scholarships

Cowan Scholarships are available to commencing university students and provide assistance with board at St Mark's College and Roseworthy Residential College. The Royal Society for the Blind in SA also has Cowan Grant funds for tertiary students.

The primary selection criterion is financial constraint. Application forms, nomination forms and additional information are available from the Cowan Grant website (see below) and the University's scholarships website. For the Cowan grants at Roseworthy, students need a letter of support from their school, the Rural Counsellor's Network, or a local community member.

Wyndham Richardson Tertiary Student Care Trust Scholarships

The Wyndham Richardson Tertiary Student Care Trust helps students by providing accommodation assistance, loans and grants for individual students. The scholarships are available for commencing and continuing students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia and undertaking a program of study on a full time basis in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the University.

To be eligible, students will need to demonstrate that:

- they are financially disadvantaged, and
- they normally reside outside metropolitan Adelaide or any other major Australian city, or normally reside in the Adelaide metropolitan area but will be studying and residing at locations remote from their normal place of abode (eg, studying and residing at Roseworthy Residential College), and
- they are residing in a residential college affiliated with the University of Adelaide or in rental accommodation.

The JE Jenkins Scholarships

These scholarships are available to commencing and continuing students studying in the areas of agriculture or social sciences. At least two scholarships will be available for students who reside at one of the residential colleges affiliated with the University of Adelaide (Aquinas, Lincoln, St. Ann's, St. Mark's, Kathleen Lumley or Roseworthy) or in other University affiliated accommodation (The Village, Mattanya or University subsidised accommodation).

Applicants must be from the country or have been resident for at least twelve months continuously in the country or have served actively for at least twelve months in one of Her Majesty's military services.

Wyatt University Scholarships for Country Students

These scholarships are awarded by the Wyatt Benevolent Institution Inc. to commencing and continuing students under 25 who have lived in South Australia for a minimum of 5 years and who normally reside outside the Adelaide metropolitan area.

Applicants must demonstrate that their family financial circumstances and geographic situation will disadvantage them in undertaking or completing their full-

time program of study. Both general and accommodation scholarships are offered.

Scholarships are available to commencing and continuing students at any one of the three South Australian universities. Residents of Broken Hill or Mildura and second/subsequent or higher program students are not eligible to apply.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic merit and financial need. Application forms are available at www.wyatt.org.au/university/education_university_country.php or the University's scholarships website and the Student Centre.

Scholarships for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students

The Centre for Australian Indigenous Research and Studies (Wilto Yerlo/CASM) offers ongoing academic and pastoral support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students studying in programs across the university including the foundation programs administered by Wilto Yerlo.

A number of scholarships are available to help students achieve their potential and some of these are administered through Wilto Yerlo. A referral service is also available to provide students with information on external organisations that offer assistance and support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. Indigenous students are encouraged to apply for the Adelaide Access Scholarships and the Commonwealth Scholarships listed elsewhere in this booklet.

A range of other scholarships are also available for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in financial need and a selection is listed below.

SC Memorial Scholarship for an Indigenous Student

This Scholarship has been established by the SC Memorial Fund to support an indigenous student undertaking a bachelor degree in Agriculture or Health Sciences (Medicine, Nursing, Dental Surgery or Oral Health) at the University of Adelaide. Applicants should have completed not less than one year of study towards their degree program.

This Scholarship is open to Australian indigenous students enrolled in a



Commonwealth supported place. The scholarship is valued at \$5,000 per year for the duration of the approved program up to a maximum of five years.

Aldinga Plains Scholarship for an Indigenous Student

This Scholarship has been established by a descendant of George and Anne Lovelock in acknowledgement of the Kurna people's relationship with this land, to support an indigenous student who is undertaking a bachelors degree at the University of Adelaide.

This scholarship is open to Australian indigenous students enrolled in a Commonwealth supported place. The scholarship is valued at \$1,000 for one year.

Scholarships for Honours Students

A wide range of scholarships are available for students undertaking Honours programs at the University of Adelaide. Intending Honours students should also consult the scholarships website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships and individual faculties and schools.

Scholarships for Continuing Students

The University of Adelaide manages a number of scholarships, which provide assistance for students in their second and subsequent years at University. A full listing of scholarships for continuing students, updated regularly, is available at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships
