The University's scholarships website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships provides a comprehensive resource for both commencing and currently enrolled students, with details about the University's scholarships and the wide variety of other scholarships that are offered by government, industry, private donors and not-for-profit organisations. This booklet contains a brief outline of some of the scholarships available.

Scholarships are listed under a number of categories, but it is strongly recommended that students look through the full range, as these are not mutually exclusive—for example, some students in financial need may also qualify for scholarships available to rural students.

Categories include scholarships for commencing, continuing, and Honours students. There are also scholarships for students in financial need; students from rural, regional or remote areas; and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.

Applications

Scholarship application forms usually need to be completed, unless indicated otherwise, and are available from the Scholarships website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships. The conditions for individual scholarships vary, but recipients are generally required to enrol on a full-time basis.

Applications for 2012 scholarships usually open early in 2012 and application forms are generally downloadable from the above website approximately 6–8 weeks before the closing date. Some scholarships may open prior to the end of 2011, so the website should be checked regularly.

2012 UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Commencing Students

The University of Adelaide manages a number of scholarships sponsored by the University, private donors, Commonwealth Government and other external agencies, which provide assistance for students about to start at University. A full listing of scholarships for commencing students, updated regularly, is available at: www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships

As well as a generous number of scholarships offered to students with outstanding Year 12 results, scholarships are also available for students who may have good (rather than outstanding) results in Year 12 but have particular difficulties in meeting the costs of attending University.

Adelaide Undergraduate Scholarships

These scholarships are available to all South Australian students who accept a Commonwealth Supported Place at the University of Adelaide in a Bachelor level program and who have demonstrated outstanding academic merit by achieving an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 99.95 (excluding all bonus points).

The scholarships provide an allowance of \$10,300 per annum (indexed annually at 3%) for up to four years to assist students with their education/living costs. No other major University scholarship may be held in conjunction with this scholarship.

Andy Thomas Scholarship

The Andy Thomas Scholarship is offered each year to an outstanding student commencing aerospace, mechanical or mechatronic engineering in a Commonwealth-supported place.

The Andy Thomas Scholarship is available to Australian citizens or permanent residents who have applied through SATAC for admission to the Bachelor of Engineering (Aerospace/Mechanical/Mechatronic) commencing in 2012 and who have not commenced a program at tertiary level previously (either university or TAFE).

In 2012 this scholarship will provide an allowance of \$6000 per annum to assist with education/living costs for up to four years, and also cover the student's Commonwealth contribution amounts for up to four years. Eligible students will be contacted by the University and invited to apply.

The University of Adelaide Principals' Scholarships

One scholarship will be available for each school in South Australia, Northern Territory, Broken Hill and non-metropolitan Victoria, which has candidates completing their Year 12 studies at that school in 2011. The University will invite school principals to nominate candidates late in 2011.

These scholarships are available to students who have made a significant contribution to their school and to the wider community. Students must also obtain an ATAR of 80 or greater, after the addition of the University's Fairway bonus (if applicable).

Students must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who expect to qualify for their Year 12 Certificate at a nominated school in 2011.

They must have applied through SATAC for admission to a Commonwealth Supported Place in an undergraduate Bachelor degree program at the University of Adelaide and be commencing post-secondary studies for the first time in 2012. In 2012 this scholarship will provide an allowance of \$5000 to assist with education/living costs for the first year of a student's program.

Cowan Scholarships

Four Scholarships are offered to commencing or continuing undergraduate students. Applicants must be supported by a reference from either their school or the Rural Counsellor's Network. Most scholarships are awarded to candidates from rural or regional backgrounds.

These Scholarships are open to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia and will be awarded to provide \$5000 for one year to support each student who must be undertaking a program of study at the Roseworthy campus and residing at the Roseworthy Residential College.

Selection for these scholarships will be made according to academic merit and financial need.

Adelaide University Sports Association Scholarship

Two scholarships are available to students who are undertaking an Undergraduate or Honours program of study at the University of Adelaide and who have been identified by the University as members of the Sports Association. The scholarships are valued at \$2500 per student and they are available for one year.

Students must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia and undertaking study as a Commonwealth supported student. Students should also be active financial members of an Adelaide University Sporting Club and undertaking study on a full-time basis.

Ern and Betty Wickes Veterinary School Scholarship

One scholarship is available for a student who is undertaking the first year of the Bachelor of Science (Pre-Veterinary) program of study at the University of Adelaide. The value of the scholarship is \$5000 for one year.

Students must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who normally reside in rural South Australia. Students must be undertaking study on a full-time basis as a Commonwealth supported student and demonstrate financial need.

The Stott Despoja Scholarship

One scholarship is available to a female student undertaking the first year of a Bachelor of Arts program of study at the University of Adelaide. The scholarship will provide payment of the student's Commonwealth contribution amount for the first year of this program.

Students must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia. Students must be undertaking study on a full-time basis as a Commonwealth supported student and demonstrate financial need.

Students in Financial Need

The University of Adelaide offers a range of scholarships to support students whose financial circumstances make it difficult for them to undertake university study.

Adelaide Access Scholarships

The University of Adelaide will award a number of scholarships for students commencing undergraduate programs in 2012 who have not commenced a program at tertiary level previously (either university or TAFE) and who can demonstrate financial need.

Applicants must be Australian citizens, permanent residents, New Zealand citizens, or holders of a permanent humanitarian visa. To be eligible for these scholarships students must enrol on a full-time basis (unless there are special circumstances preventing this, such as a disability).

In 2012 the value of the Adelaide Access Scholarships will be \$2500 per annum for the duration of their studies, up to a maximum of four years.

Commonwealth Scholarships

The Commonwealth Government offers a significant number of scholarships each year for students studying at the University of Adelaide through Commonwealth income support scholarships. The scholarships are to assist students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those from rural and regional areas, and Indigenous students, with the costs associated with higher education.

Student Start-up Scholarships and Relocation Scholarships

In 2011 all university students receiving income support provided through Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY received a \$2194 Student Start-up Scholarship from Centrelink for each year of their program, indexed for inflation. This also includes students who are assisted under veteran's schemes.

All university students receiving Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY who have to live away from their family home will be assisted by a Relocation Scholarship from Centrelink. In 2011 this scholarship provided \$4129 for students in their first year at university and \$1031 in each year thereafter and is indexed. Students who are eligible for a Relocation Scholarship will also receive a Student Start-up Scholarship.

To be eligible for either the Student Start-up Scholarship or the Relocation Scholarship, students must be Australian citizens or holders of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa and must be enrolled on a full-time basis (unless there are special circumstances preventing this, such as a disability).

Walter and Dorothy Duncan Trust

The Trust provides financial assistance with educational costs for students who have difficulty achieving equity of access to higher education, e.g. those from low socio-economic backgrounds, isolated and rural areas, non-English speaking backgrounds, students with a disability, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, and women pursuing studies in fields under-represented by women.

Grant amounts vary depending on need. Demonstrated academic merit is also required.

Lottie and Aileen Connon Fund Grants

Two grants are available to continuing students undertaking a Bachelors degree in the Faculty of Health Sciences (with a preference for studies in Medicine) at the University of Adelaide.

Two grants of \$5000 each are available to students in their second year and are available for one year. Students must be Australian citizens who are undertaking study on a full-time basis as Commonwealth supported students and who demonstrate financial need.

Resthaven Undergraduate Scholarships for Nursing students

Three scholarships are available to students in their second year of the Bachelor of Nursing program at the University of Adelaide. Each scholarship is valued at \$5000 per year payable for a maximum period of two years.

These scholarships are available to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia. Students must be undertaking study on a full-time basis as a Commonwealth supported student and demonstrate academic merit and financial need.

Students from Rural, Regional or Remote Areas

Students from rural, regional and remote areas of Australia should also check the entries in the earlier section on scholarships for students in financial need. A selection of scholarships is listed below, but check the website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships for a comprehensive list.

The Rotary Club of Barossa Valley Foundation Scholarship

One scholarship is available to support a student from the Barossa/Eden Valley region of South Australia who is commencing any undergraduate program of study at the University of Adelaide.

The scholarship is valued at \$1500 per year payable for a maximum period of two years. This scholarship is available to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia.

Students must be undertaking study on a full-time basis as a Commonwealth supported student and demonstrate financial need.

Wyndham Richardson Tertiary Student Care Trust Scholarships

The Wyndham Richardson Tertiary Student Care Trust helps students by providing accommodation assistance, loans and grants for individual students.

The scholarships are available for commencing and continuing students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia and undertaking a program of study on a full-time basis in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the University.

To be eligible, students will need to demonstrate that:

- they are financially disadvantaged, and
- they normally reside outside metropolitan Adelaide or any other major Australian city, or normally reside in the Adelaide metropolitan area but will be studying and residing at locations remote from their normal place of abode (e.g. studying and residing at Roseworthy Residential College), and
- they are residing in a residential college affiliated with the University of Adelaide or in rental accommodation.

The JE Jenkins Scholarships

These scholarships are available to commencing and continuing students studying in the areas of agriculture or social sciences. At least two scholarships will be available for students who reside at one of the residential colleges affiliated with the University of Adelaide (Aquinas, Lincoln, St. Ann's, St. Mark's, Kathleen Lumley or Roseworthy) or in other University affiliated accommodation (The Village, Mattanya or University subsidised accommodation).

Applicants must be from the country or have been resident for at least 12 months continuously in the country or have served actively for at least 12 months in one of Her Majesty's military services.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Unit: Wilto Yerlo offers ongoing academic and pastoral support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students studying in programs across the University including the foundation programs administered by Wilto Yerlo.

A number of scholarships are available to help students achieve their potential and some of these are administered through Wilto Yerlo. A referral service is also available to provide students with information on external organisations that offer assistance and support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. A range of other scholarships are also available for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in financial need and a selection is listed following.

Commonwealth Scholarships for Indigenous students

The Commonwealth Government offers a significant number of scholarships each year for Indigenous students studying at the University of Adelaide.

The scholarships are to assist Indigenous students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those from rural and regional areas, with the costs associated with higher education. There are several types of Commonwealth scholarships available to Indigenous students in 2012, as follows.

Indigenous Access Scholarship

This Scholarship is to assist Indigenous students from regional or remote areas who are in financial need with the start up costs of attending university. In 2011 the value of the scholarship was \$4442. Students must be enrolled in or undertaking a foundation program with Wilto Yerlo, an undergraduate program or the Graduate Diploma of Education at the University of Adelaide. This scholarship is available for one year.

Indigenous Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarships

These Scholarships are to assist Indigenous students from regional or remote areas who are in financial need with accommodation costs. In 2011 these scholarships were valued at \$4580 per year. Students must be enrolled in or undertaking a foundation program with Wilto Yerlo, an undergraduate program or the Graduate Diploma of Education at the University of Adelaide. These scholarships are available for one year for foundation studies and the Graduate Diploma of Education and for a maximum of four years for an undergraduate program.

Indigenous Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarships

These Scholarships are to assist with education costs for Indigenous students in financial need. In 2011 these scholarships were valued at \$2290 per year. Students must be enrolled in or undertaking a foundation program with Wilto Yerlo, an undergraduate program or the Graduate Diploma of Education at the University of Adelaide. These scholarships are available for one year for foundation studies and the Graduate Diploma of Education and for a maximum of four years for an undergraduate program.

SA Water Undergraduate Indigenous Scholarship

SA Water is providing one scholarship to a commencing Indigenous student undertaking study in the field of Engineering, Finance, Commerce, Economics, Science or Computer Sciences at the University of Adelaide. The value of the scholarship is \$5000 per year and will be available up to a maximum of four years for Engineering or a maximum of three years for Finance, Commerce, Economics, Science or Computer Science.

The scholarships are available to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia. Students must be undertaking study on a full-time basis as a Commonwealth supported student.

Indigenous Honours Scholarships

The University will offer up to four University of Adelaide Indigenous Honours Scholarships to Indigenous students from South Australia. Applicants for the scholarship must be undertaking an Honours program at the University of Adelaide. These scholarships will provide full fee remission and a payment of \$4000 for the year of a student's Honours program at the University of Adelaide.

The scholarships are available to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia. Students must be undertaking study on a full-time basis as a Commonwealth supported student and demonstrate financial need.

Honours Students

A wide range of scholarships are available for students undertaking Honours programs at the University of Adelaide. Intending Honours students should also consult the scholarships website at www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships and individual faculties and schools.

Continuing Students

The University of Adelaide manages a number of scholarships, which provide assistance for students in their second and subsequent years at University. A full listing of scholarships for continuing students, updated regularly, is available at: www.adelaide.edu.au/scholarships

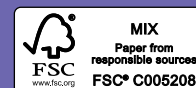
