As in previous years, the PSRF will also consider requests for support for ARC Federation Fellowship applications.

Applications for funding are reviewed by the Projects Committee using the guidelines above. The committee allocates the funds on the basis of:

- 1. the quality of the project
- 2. the abilities of the proponents
- 3. the relative importance of the outcomes (taking into account the aims of the Nature Foundation and information from appropriate technical experts)
- 4. value for money (this includes the potential of the project to attract funds from other sources: for example, sponsors or donors)
- 5. funds available at that time, and
- 6. attractiveness of the project to potential sponsors

Gottschalk, FAA.</p> <p>Its purpose is to recognise outstanding research in the medical sciences by scientists under 40 years at the closing date, except in the case of significant interruptions to a research career. The awardee may not be a Fellow of the Academy.
