<p>The World Community Grid invites researchers to apply to use its powerful grid technology at no cost for projects that benefit humanity. Grid technology enables researchers to access tremendous amounts of power, exceeding that of several supercomputers, to run complex computations and to accelerate the pace of their research.</p> <p>Research projects that benefit from grid technology are those that perform computations that require millions of computer processing units (CPUs) and that can be divided into smaller independent computations.</p> <p>Examples of potential fields of study include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
