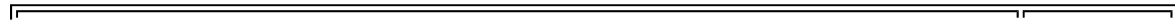

<p>NHMRC has commenced implementation of a new Research Grants Management System to assist researchers and RAOs by supporting the full grants management process from application through to grant acquittal. RGMS features a significant on-line component allowing:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Researchers to maintain their profile and CV (which will automatically upload into applications). 2. Applicants, review panel members and external assessors to submit information directly into the system. 3. Grant holders and RAOs to manage grants (ethics approvals, progress and financial reports, transfers, variation requests, acquittal and final reporting). <p>The new RGMS is planned to be fully operational by December 2009 following a staged implementation.
