<p>NHMRC has commenced implementation of a new Research Grants Management System to assist researchers and RAOs by supporting the full grants management process from application through to grant acquittal. RGMS features a significant on-line component allowing:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Researchers to maintain their profile and CV (which will automatically upload into applications).</li> <li>2. Applicants, review panel members and external assessors to submit information directly into the system.</li> <li>3. Grant holders and RAOs to manage grants (ethics approvals, progress and financial reports, transfers, variation requests, acquittal and final reporting).</li> </ol> <p>The new RGMS is planned to be fully operational by December 2009 following a staged implementation.
