**3. Post Doctoral Fellowship (Up to \$100,000/year for max 3 years):** Candidates must have been awarded their PhD **no more than three years prior** to the closing date for applications or else their PhD **must be awarded by December** of the year of application. ## **4. PhD Scholarships (\$40,000/year for max 3 years):**

Projects which include an environmental science component will be encouraged and assessed on merit along with all applications.
