However, the other three categories, ie books, book chapters and conference publications have shown a decrease.</p> <p>Even though our HERDC yield has increased, the HERDC score which attracts funding is less this year. 3. Investigator-Initiated Research Award: The Investigator-Initiated Research Award (IIRA) is intended to support studies that make an important contribution to SCI research and/or patient care. Projects should address an Area of Encouragement and be applicable to the health care needs of the military service members, their family members, and/or the U.S. veteran population. All applications must specifically and clearly address the military relevance of the proposed research. Collaboration with military researchers and clinicians is encouraged. **Internal deadline is 20 August 2009.**

4. Exploration – Hypothesis Development Award: The SCIRP Exploration – Hypothesis Development Award (EHDA) supports the initial exploration of innovative, untested, high-risk, high-gain, and potentially groundbreaking concepts in the SCI research field. Results of studies conducted through this award may provide the scientific rationale upon which a new hypothesis can be based, or they should provide initial principles of an innovative hypothesis. This award is designed to provide investigators with the opportunity to pursue serendipitous observations. 5. Advanced Technology/Therapeutic Development Award: The Advanced Technology/Therapeutic Development Award (AT/TDA) is intended to support demonstration studies of pharmaceuticals (drugs, biologics, and vaccines) and medical devices in preclinical systems and/or the testing of therapeutics and devices in clinical studies. <p>Fiscal Year 2009 (FY09) congressional appropriations have provided \$112 million to the Department of Defense (DOD) Peer Reviewed Orthopaedic Research Program (PRORP). This program will support innovative, high-impact, clinically relevant research to advance treatment and rapid rehabilitation from musculoskeletal injuries sustained during military combat or combat-related activities.</p> <p>PRORP Program Announcements have been released in five funding mechanisms by the Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs. The Program Announcements are open and accepting submissions. Independent investigators, scientists and clinicians (at all academic levels) in the fields of: Trauma, Emergency Medicine, Orthopaedic Specialists, Orthopedic Surgery, Rehabilitation, Orthopaedic Materials Science and Engineering, Sports Medicine, and Physical Therapy are eligible to apply. The five funding mechanisms are:</p> <p>1. Clinical Trial Award: support the rapid implementation of clinical trials with the potential to have a significant impact on the <i>acute care</i> of military combat-relevant orthopaedic injuries. 2. Hypothesis Development Award: supports the initial exploration of innovative, untested, and potentially groundbreaking concepts in the field of orthopaedic research that may lead to promising new products, pharmacologic agents (drugs or biologics), behavioral interventions, devices, clinical guidance or emerging technologies for military combat-relevant orthopaedic injuries or rehabilitative care. **Internal deadline is 18 August 2009.**

3. Idea Development Award: support high-impact, innovative research that will drive the field forward. The proposed research should provide a significant benefit for the field of military combat-relevant orthopaedic injuries research. The proposed research is expected to make an important and original contribution to advancing combat-relevant orthopaedic research or orthopaedic medicine. **Internal deadline is 6 August 2009.**

4. Technology Development Award: support product-driven research aimed at developing technologies and related resources for use by both the applicant's laboratory and the orthopaedic research community to promote basic and preclinical research on musculoskeletal injuries related to military service. **Internal deadline is 6 August 2009.**
