<p>The 2008 DEEWR HERDC has now been finalised. Thank you all for your input and cooperation.</p> <p>Our total number of publications this year is 189 higher than 2007, an increase of 7%. The number of journal articles is 269 more than last year, a very good result in light of the ERA collection. However, the other three categories, ie books, book chapters and conference publications have shown a decrease.</p> <p>Even though our HERDC yield has increased, the HERDC score which attracts funding is less this year.
