



The 2006 Australian Institute of Urban Studies (South Australia) Early Career Research Prize

The *AIUS Urban Studies Early Career Research Prize* is an annual prize of \$1,500 awarded for an outstanding research paper by an Early Career Researcher addressing an urban theme of relevance to South Australia. Entries are encouraged from all disciplines. Manuscripts of up to 5,000 words are sought. The prize will be judged by a panel comprised of members of AIUS (SA Branch) and awarding of the prize will be at the discretion of the judges.

The prize is for sole or joint authored papers. All authors should be Early Career Researchers, defined as being either post graduate students or persons with a Doctorate of less than four years. Persons who are post graduate students who are/or have been academic staff members for more than four years in total are not considered ECRs for the purposes of this prize.

The deadline for papers will be November 30th 2006. No late entries will be considered. Papers need to be original work, not previously published elsewhere. The prize will be announced at the first AIUS seminar in early 2007. It is a condition of the award that the winning paper is presented as a seminar during the AIUS luncheon seminar series and it will be published on the AIUS website.
