

# Invitation for applications supporting horticultural research and development opens 6 October 2007

Horticulture Australia Limited (HAL) is responsible for the national coordination and management of industry and publicly funded research and development (R&D) for Australia's horticulture industries. These include fruit, vegetables, nuts, nursery, turf, cut flowers and extractive crops.

In investing in R&D activities HAL is able to provide 100 per cent funding (industry levies matched with Australian Government funds) as well as being able to match voluntary contributions on a dollar-for-dollar basis.

R&D activities funded by HAL include projects in the areas of biotechnology, breeding, plant health, crop production, resource management, environment, postharvest, quality assurance, food safety, biosecurity, skills development, market research, supply chain management, market development, market access and industry communication.
