Show that this proposal's goal is to foster academic mobility and exchange of information and not to finance research; 4. Include a strategy to pursue linkages after the initial activity; 5. Fernand Braudel Senior Fellowship	Internal Deadline
<p>The Fernand Braudel Senior Fellowship Programme provides a framework for established academics with an international reputation for the pursuit of research at the Institute.</p> <p>Fellows carry out their research in one of the Institute's four departments. The departments invite fellows to participate in the activities which they organize (seminars, workshops, colloquia). They also hope that fellows will make contact with researchers with the same academic interests as them, and they may be involved in the teaching and thesis supervision tasks of Institute's professors. Fellows may be associated with one of the research projects under way at the Institute.</p> <p>The monthly grant is €3000 for fellows on unpaid leave. Successful applicants benefiting from other salaries must disclose this to the EUI, as the amount of the fellowship will be fixed at a lower rate in function of the additional income.</p> <p>The fellowships will be for 3 to 10 months (candidates are invited to indicate the intended length of stay in their application noting that fellowships will generally not be awarded for the months of July and August).
