With a wealth of leadership experience spanning technical, manufacturing, supply and distribution roles, Mark Allison has been a champion of Australian agriculture and agribusiness for over 40 years. As the Managing Director and CEO of Elders, one of Australia's oldest and largest agricultural companies, Mark has a highly successful track record of strategic leadership, turning around complex businesses for wider impact and benefit of the agricultural industry in Australia.

Born into a sugarcane and beef cattle family in Ayr, north-eastern Queensland, agriculture was a passion for Mark from an early age. Combining an Agricultural Science degree with a Bachelor of Economics at the University of Queensland provided a foundation for Mark to build a career that would make a tangible contribution to the rural and regional communities for which he cares so deeply.

Starting as a research agronomist in Queensland's Darling Downs and Lockyer Valley horticultural region, Mark also worked in cotton and broadacre cropping in north-western New South Wales. Improving the sustainability and environmental stability of the industry was also a focus through research into new varieties, technology and farming systems.

Something that many may not know about Mark, is that he is also an enthusiastic musician and has written and recorded more than 140 songs across nine albums, dabbling in multiple genres including, pop, reggae, country, folk and rock.

Transitioning away from research and into management and leadership roles, Mark has been Managing Director and CEO of CropCare Australasia, Wesfarmers CSBP, Wesfarmers Landmark, Farmoz, Incitec Fertilisers and Grain Growers Limited. He joined Elders Limited as a Non-Executive Director in December 2009, and served as Chairman and Executive Chairman. In May 2014 Mark was appointed to the position of Managing Director/CEO of Elders Limited, his seventh CEO role.

Through his strategy and leadership, Mark Allison is widely recognised for Elders' dramatic turnaround after being hit hard by the global financial crisis. Since 2014, Mark has overseen Elders evolution into a dominant and successful company with a market capitalisation that has grown from \$50 million to \$2.2 billion at its peak.
