Mrs Elizabeth Waite (undated). This is the only photograph we have of Peter Waite's mother. After the death of Peter's father, James as a result of a fall from a horse in 1834, this resilient woman managed their modest family farm, Pitcairn, near Kirkcaldy in Scotland. Alone Elizabeth raised their three young sons to manhood. At the time of their father's death, his sons James, David and Peter were aged 5 years, 3 years and 5 months respectively.

On Monday 26th September we were once again delighted with a beautiful performance in the Ballroom

Bernhard Crusell (1775-1838) a Finnish composer, contemporary of Weber and Spohr. His artistic output consists almost exclusively of music involving the clarinet, of which he was also the leading exponent in the early decades of the 19th century.

Four Adelaide chamber musicians presented two of Crusell's much loved clarinet quartets, Quartet for clarinet and string trio No. 3 in D Major, Op.7 and Quartet for clarinet and string trio No. 2 in C Minor, Op.4
