Jean Adelaide Madeline Dent Prize for Violin (AMEB)

Establishment

In 2001, Jean Adelaide Madeline Dent bequeathed \$20,000 to the University of Adelaide to establish an annual scholarship for violin students studying for the AMEB Diploma L. Mus. A. to be known as the Jean Adelaide Madeline Dent Scholarship. The purpose was varied under a Trust Variation Scheme approved the Attorney General of South Australia on 10 March 2016 to offer the scholarship to violin students studying for any AMEB (SA) Diploma exam, with a preference to the LMusA.

Title

 The prize shall be known as the 'Jean Adelaide Madeline Dent Prize for Violin (AMEB)'.

Value

2. The value of the Prize shall be \$2,800 or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of income available from the Endowment Fund.

Eligibility

- To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must have undertaken an AMEB diploma examination in violin, conducted in South Australia by the Australian Music Examinations Board (AMEB) (SA & NT), in the year for which the Prize is awarded.
- 4. Candidates are ineligible if they have provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.

Selection of Candidate

- The prize will be awarded annually based on the results of the candidates' AMEB diploma examinations in violin, with preference for the LMusA exam, as determined by the AMEB Examiners. The Prizes Committee will make the final selection based on the candidate deemed most outstanding taking into consideration aptitude, enthusiasm and participation.
- 6. The Prize shall not be awarded more than once to the same person.
- If the Prize is not awarded in any year, then the available income distribution shall be added to the capital sum in the Endowment Fund.

Administration and Variations

- 8. The Prize will be administered by the Coursework Scholarships and Prizes Office.
- 9. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
- Once the Prize has been withdrawn for that year, it may be re-awarded to the next eligible student at the discretion of the Australian Music Examinations Board and subject to available funding.
