

Research Study Explores a Once Weekly Medication for Type 2 Diabetes

Exenatide (Byetta) is an FDA-approved medication for managing blood sugar levels in people with Type 2 Diabetes. At present, it is typically administered twice daily.

A longer-acting, once weekly dose of this medication is being studied at the University of Adelaide to further explore how the treatment slows down the process of food emptying from the stomach thereby causing blood sugar levels to go down and the effects on the body between the two actions.
