Being Kaurna in South Australia

Synopsis:

What does it mean to be Kaurna in South Australia in the twenty-first century?

The Kaurna people are the Indigenous people of the Adelaide Plains in South Australia. Kaurna country extends from Cape Jervis south of Adelaide to Crystal Brook in the north, and is bounded by the Mount Lofty Ranges to the east and Gulf St Vincent to the west.

This presentation aims to explore the significance and complexities of Indigenous identity in South Australia. In particular, it will focus on the Kaurna people of South Australia and will highlight several experiences of the Kaurna community in terms of the significance of 'belonging'. The findings of this research will contribute to local and global understandings of the impact of 'belonging' in process of Indigenous identity formation.
