## **APEAC Major and minor revision categories**

All proposals to introduce new programs (including double, combined or jointly-conferred academic awards), and all proposals to permanently delete existing programs from the University's offerings must be considered by APEAC.

APEAC must also consider 'Major Revisions' to existing programs. Listed below are categories classified as **major revisions** which require a proposal to be presented to the Academic Program Entry and Approval Committee (APEAC) for recommendation to Academic Board (or, for proposals regarding entry changes, the DVC(A)). A list of **minor revisions** <u>not</u> requiring consideration by APEAC are also listed. The examples below are representative only – other examples may exist.
