

Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Framework - SNAPSHOT

ESOS

- The <u>Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000</u> sets out the legal framework governing delivery of education to overseas students studying in Australia.
- The University classifies the ESOS Act as a Tier 1 piece of legislation.
- ESOS only applies to students on an Australian <u>Student Visa</u> enrolled in an onshore program.
- ESOS is consumer protection legislation that establishes and maintains nationally consistent standards, with the aim to promote quality education.
- The Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) regulates ESOS.
- Only <u>Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS)</u> registered programs at a CRICOS registered provider can be offered to international students studying under a student visa.
- All CRICOS registered programs must be available full-time and not be offered exclusively in an external mode.
- The University's CRICOS number (00123M) must be displayed on all promotional materials (including electronic) used to invite international students to study at the University.

The National Code of Practice for Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2018 (National Code)

- The <u>National Code</u> is a legislative instrument made under the ESOS Act 2000 and sets out nationally consistent standards to support providers to deliver quality education and training to international students.
- There are 2 parts to the National Code, A & B. Part B contains 11 standards that providers must meet in their interactions with international students. The University is required to evidence compliance with all parts to maintain its registration.
- <u>National Code Fact Sheets</u> are available to assist providers interpret and apply the requirements and are continually updated to reflect questions from the sector.
