

UTR1.135 - ADELAIDE LAW REVIEW PRIZE FOR ASSOCIATE EDITORS

Background

- A. This Prize was established in 1995 and was awarded for the best article submitted to the Australian Journal of Legal History.
- B. In 2014, as the Australian Journal of Legal History ceased to exist. The University amended the Rules to award up to four prizes for students completing the Adelaide Law Review course in the Bachelor of Laws or Bachelor of Laws (Honours) programs.
- C. This prize is administered by the Adelaide Law School.

Name of the fund

1. The capital sum, all income arising from the capital sum and any accumulations and additions thereto together form a fund called the 'Adelaide Law Review Prize' ('fund').

Investment of the fund

2. The fund is to be amalgamated for the purposes of investment, and held in a common fund, and the net income earned by the common fund shall be credited, rateably, to the funds so amalgamated and thereafter distributed according to the terms of the Prize.

Obligations

3. In administering the fund, the University must adhere to the terms specified and is obliged:-
 - (a) to invest the capital sum according to the directions of the donor; and
 - (b) to administer a prize in the manner described in the following Rules.

Rules

Value

There will be up to four prizes awarded annually. Although the prizes will not bear a cash value, each prize winner will be offered a paid internship to serve as an Associate Editor of the Adelaide Law Review in the following year (which will be partially funded from the endowed funds).

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Prize students must be completing the Adelaide Law Review course in the Bachelor of Laws program in the year for which the Prize is awarded.

Selection of Candidate

The Editors in Chief of the Adelaide Law Review will award the Prize to the students selected to act as Associate Editors.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
