The Cloisters

Adelaide University Mixed Football Team, 1969

Chosen by: Michelle Wilson, Adelaide University Sport and Fitness General Manager

This is a joyful photograph capturing the spirit of community and sport. The diversity it represents is quite amazing for AFL as it predates the inclusion of a formal women's football competition.

On Dit Lane

Adelaide University Rowing Crew, 1922

Chosen by: Mike Daws, Adelaide University Sport General Manager 2009–2018

Winning the prestigious Oxford and Cambridge Cup has always been seen as the pinnacle of men's rowing in University Sport. An intervarsity race between men's eights, it was first held in 1888. Over its 130+ year history, Adelaide has won the race on only 11 occasions, remarkably four times over an eight-year period from 2009 to 2016.

When held in Adelaide, the race was previously held on the Port River during the early years, as this photo from 1922 shows.

Indicating how difficult it has been to win the race, there was a 40-year gap from 1934 to 1974 and a 30-year gap from 1979 to 2009 when Adelaide was unable to take the Cup, although it has been the runner-up on more than 20 occasions over its history.

Union House

Intersports Hockey Team, 1956

Chosen by: David Penn, Adelaide University Sports and Fitness President and Adelaide University Cricket Club Life Member

I chose this image because it illustrates how people of very different backgrounds and experiences can be brought together by the love of their chosen sport. I think it also captures a shift in the social history of the University, showing how international students have become such an important part of the life of the campus.

Intersports Judo Team, 1960

Chosen by: Michael Headland, Adelaide University Judo Club Head Coach 1972–present

The first Adelaide University Judo Intersports team off to Brisbane only two years after the Club was founded in 1958. The team was coached by Joe Revalk.

Darling West

Intersports Cricket Team, 1925

Chosen by: Rob O'Shannassy, Adelaide University Cricket Club Historian and former Player, Blues Award Winner 1968, Adelaide University Cricket Club Blues Committee Member 1972–present

Photo of the 1925 Intersports team that defeated Sydney in December 1925. The team went on to win the South Australian Cricket Association A Grade Premiership in April 1926.

Notable players include SA State players: N A Walsh, W C Alexander, L B Power, L S Walsh, D G McKay, B W Hone. Sir Brian William Hone was a noted educationalist and held the post of Headmaster of Melbourne Grammar. Douglas Gordon McKay was an eminent Paediatric Surgeon.

Barr Smith Library, Level 3

Intersports Women's Hockey Team, 1950

This 1950 team achieved what few other hockey teams of the era managed, they seized a win from the highly competitive Eastern State universities. I selected this photo to celebrate this achievement and for the sense of joy and pride you can see on the team's faces. I also love the retro look of the uniforms.

Intersports Swimming Team, 1935

While there have been few changes to many sports over the past 125 years, there have been many changes in the uniforms. This photograph from 1935 shows the formality of sport in that era – even swimming. It is great to see a team with equal gender representation, even in 1935.

Intersports Football Club, 1961

The 1960s was a golden era for the Adelaide University Football Club under coach Allan Greer (1960–67). This 1961 Intersports team was captained Tony Clarkson, a Sturt and South Australian State player. The Club played in every A1 Grand Final in the 'Sixties, winning six premierships. This was an enviable record and a performance unsurpassed in amateur league history.

Intersports Lacrosse Team, 1990

I completed a Bachelor in Mechanical and Sports Engineering at Adelaide University, and part of that degree focused on the design of sports equipment and clothing.
