9. Print, copy, scan

Printing, photocopying, and scanning is available at each library. You can scan to USB, photocopy, and print on all multi-functional devices found around the library.

Printing and photocopying uses your student printing quota. Scanning is free.

To scan directly to your email, cloud storage, or phone/tablet, use the flatbed scanner on Level 3 of the Barr Smith Library.

10. Opening hours

The University Library's hours vary across campuses. For up to date information, check the opening hours on the library website. For those who like to study late (or early!), Level 3 of the Barr Smith Library is open 24/7, just bring your student ID card to gain access.

1. Need help?

Ask Library is your first point of contact for all library enquiries. Ask Library staff (look for the red shirts!) are on hand to answer any questions you might have regarding using the library's services and facilities and finding resources for your studies. 2. Find readings for your course

Navigate to your course in **MyUni** and look for the link to *Course Readings* on the left. From here, you will be able to access book chapters, journal articles, websites, and more.

Some courses still have print course readers, which are available for purchase from the University's online shop. Once ordered, you can collect them from Ask Library on Level 3 of the Barr Smith Library.

3. Borrowing

Use Library Search on the library's homepage to search our resources and find items available in the collection.

- Your student ID card is your library card.
- Borrow up to 50 items at a time.
- The standard loan time is 10 weeks.
- If an item you have borrowed is subsequently requested by another patron, you will have 7 days to return the item.
- Keep an eye out for library notices and due dates via email and sms.

4. Login to MyLibrary

Login to MyLibrary on the library website to request items, confirm what you have on loan (and when it's due back), and track your requests.
