

## Abstracts for Posters

The Mycology MasterClass is held every 2 years and is internationally recognised as a valuable and prestigious advanced training program in medical mycology. It attracts significant demand for places and will once again reflect current clinical and laboratory practice with a program of lectures and problem based learning exercises. The program has been formulated by ANZMIG and is a consensus of the most topical issues in mycology selected by the key Australasian opinion leaders in this field.

The Mycology MasterClass will incorporate a poster display and viewing session. Posters will be displayed from Thursday morning until Saturday afternoon. A poster viewing session will be held on the evening of Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> Nov and authors will be required at their posters during this time. Posters are encouraged that feature interesting or unusual fungal cases and/or trainee research projects on all topics that reflect the interests of ANZMIG.

Posters will be judged during the viewing session and a \$500 prize will be offered for the best poster.

### Poster Abstract Submission Guidelines

1. Abstracts must be no more than **250 words**.
2. Abstracts should not contain references, figures or tables.
3. Please submit a Word document using Arial font size 12. The title is to be left- aligned, each word in Upper and Lower Case (not CAPITALS) followed by double spacing, then author/s name/s in upper and lower case. Use number superscripts for authors' institutional affiliations and list each author's affiliation and city below the names. The name of the presenting author must be underlined:
  - a. Title (Left aligned, Upper and Lower Case - not all caps)
  - b. Surname, first name <sup>1</sup>, Surname, first name <sup>1</sup>, Surname, first name <sup>2</sup>
  - c. 1 Organisation, City (one line per affiliation)
  - d. Content – no more than 250 words
  - e. Footer: Include submitting author name, email and contact phone number (this information will not be published)
4. Include a statement on ethical compliance as appropriate, which is not counted in word limit.

5. Do not use different fonts, italics, underlining, bold text or symbols except where specified in these instructions, and italics for scientific names where appropriate.

6. All abstracts will be printed as submitted, so should be thoroughly checked for spelling and grammar before submitting.

7. By submitting an abstract the author is giving permission for their abstract to be published in the online handbook, conference app, ASID website, and any accompanying CD or USB.

### Abstract Submission

3. If you are the presenting author on more than one abstract, please number the e-mail file as follows:

4. Abstracts **MUST** be received on or before close of business Monday 29th May. You will be emailed an acknowledgment of receipt.

### Notification of Acceptance

In order to be accepted, the presenting author **MUST** have registered to attend the Mycology MasterClass. **Please be aware that registrations typically sell out quickly.**

There are only 80 available places and these fill quickly. Authors will be advised by Friday 30th Jun whether or not their abstracts have been accepted for a poster.

1. Accepted abstracts will be published in the online MMCX app and made available to delegates. Abstracts will be published only if the presenting author is registered. If authors do not register by the specified date of Friday 28<sup>th</sup> Jul, the abstract will not appear in the program and will not be published.

**Presenting authors must be registered in order to be included in the MMCX program.**
