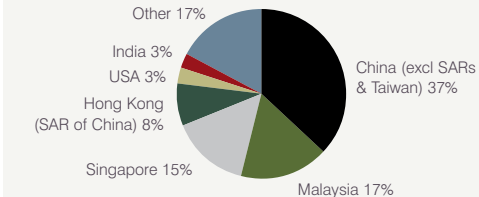

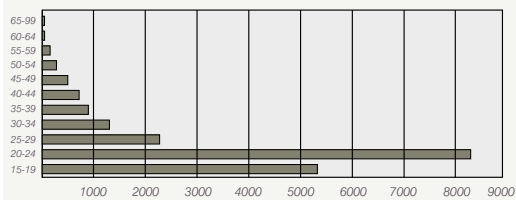

## INTERNATIONAL ENROLMENTS

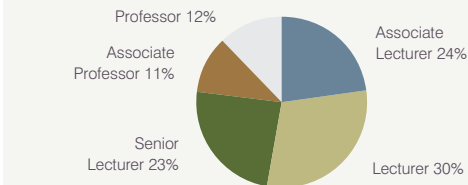
By country 2006 (includes onshore and offshore)

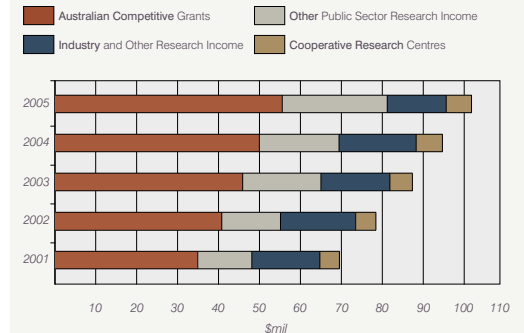

## Quick Facts

- The University of Adelaide (founded 1874) is the third-oldest University in Australia, behind the universities of Sydney (1851) and Melbourne (1853) and is older than all but a handful of universities in England.
- It was the first Australian university (in 1881) to open its doors to women on equal terms, ahead of Oxford (1920) and Cambridge (1948), and throughout its history has been a pioneer in many fields.
- The University numbers five Nobel Laureates among its alumni, and has produced 100 Rhodes Scholars (at December 2006). Its graduates include many people who have made an outstanding impact on their communities world-wide.
- Adelaide is one of the top research universities in Australia. National Competitive Research Grants earnings by its Academic Researchers have consistently been the highest per capita of any Australian University.



- The University has four Adelaide campuses. **North Terrace**, in the cultural heart of the city of Adelaide, is the main campus and site of most teaching and research facilities. **Thebarton** campus in the inner western suburbs is one of the premier university-owned technology/research parks in Australia. **Waite** campus in suburban Urrbrae encompasses the largest agricultural research complex in the Southern hemisphere, with many co-located government and industry partners. **Roseworthy** campus, 50km north of Adelaide, is an internationally renowned centre of excellence in dryland agriculture and animal production, also hosting several collaborative centres.
- There are five faculties: Engineering, Computer and Mathematical Sciences; Health Sciences; Humanities and Social Sciences; Professions; and Sciences.
- Adelaide is a comprehensive university offering courses at both undergraduate and postgraduate degree and diploma level across a wide range of disciplines in the sciences, health sciences, engineering, computer and mathematical science, humanities and social sciences, commerce, finance and management, architecture, landscape architecture and urban design, education and law.
- The University is one of the major employers in the state of South Australia, employing 2665 staff in 2006.
- Goals:** Growth with excellence in our educational activities; student focus in the experiences we provide for those who study here; scale and focus in the pursuit of continued research excellence; and community engagement.
