Open Electives and Broadening Electives

Open (free choice) elective courses can be chosen from the Faculty of the Professions or any faculty in the University, where courses are not restricted.

To satisfy the requirements for Broadening Electives, students must complete courses to the value of 9 units. Students in the Bachelor of

Economics must choose courses outside of the subject areas specified in the [Broadening Electives list](#). These include ACCTING, CORPFIN, ECON, LAW, STATS.
