Degree Information

- Students must ensure they are correctly enrolled in accordance with the Academic <u>Program Rules</u>.
- A total of 96 is required to complete the Bachelor of Economics with Bachelor of Finance.
- AND MATHS 1010 Applications of Quantitative Methods in Finance I OR MATHS 1011 Mathematics IA AND MATHS 1012 Mathematics IB. Students should only consider Maths IA/B if they have completed the highest level of high school maths, have a genuine love for maths, and are looking at take maths courses as electives at levels II and III. Extra Level I maths courses in addition to the selected combination, including Economics maths, are NOT permitted and will NOT count as Elective Courses.

Open Electives and Broadening Electives

Open (free choice) elective courses can be chosen from the Faculty of the Professions or any faculty in the University, where courses are not restricted.

Broadening elective courses are those which are outside their primary discipline area of study and can be searched using the Course Planner

To satisfy the requirements for Broadening Electives, students must complete courses to the value of 9 units. Students in the Bachelor of Economics must choose courses outside of the subject areas specified in the Broadening
