Preface

This publication comprises a consolidated list of Roseworthy graduates as an invaluable reference tool for the University of Adelaide Archives, the Roseworthy Old Collegians Association (ROCA) and future researchers.

The University of Adelaide Archives staff in conjunction with the Roseworthy subgroup of the University Archives Volunteer Group and ROCA undertook to compile the complete list of graduates from Roseworthy from the first class in 1883 to 2005. The list includes all graduates from Roseworthy including

- Roseworthy Agricultural College 1883 – 1974
- Roseworthy College of Advanced Education 1974 – 1990
- Roseworthy Campus, The University of Adelaide 1991 – 2005.

The list has been compiled mainly from the following sources:

- Roseworthy Agricultural College Annual Reports
- Student Magazines
- Graduate boards in the Campus Dining Room
- Graduation Ceremony lists.

The key contributors to this document have been Mr Wilf Bowen and Mr Ron Tuckwell (ROCA), Mr Darren Koopman (Roseworthy Campus), Ms Sue Coppin and Ms Tupp Carmody (University of Adelaide Archives).

The list is presented in two forms.

- Alphabetically
- Chronologically by year of graduation.

As a result of this publication, future researchers will be able to identify graduates, qualifications attained and the year of graduation from a single source. Every endeavour has been undertaken to ensure accuracy, but the records have been difficult to collate and some errors may be subsequently uncovered.

How to use this publication

Section 1

Key to Abbreviations of Awards

This summary of abbreviations is as complete and accurate as available records could provide. However slight variations occurred over time. Every effort has been made to clearly indicate the discipline in which the qualification was achieved. Groupings are according to disciplines, namely:

1. Agriculture
2. Farm Management
3. Horse Husbandry
4. Natural Resource Management
5. Oenology/Wine Science

Section 2

Alphabetical List of All Graduates from Roseworthy 1886 to 2005

This is to be used to establish the following:

1. Year of graduation; and
2. Qualification received.

Where more than one qualification was awarded from a Roseworthy course, each qualification is listed alongside the recipient's name with the year of each graduation.

Year of graduation is the year in which the qualification was received. In the years to 2000 graduations were generally held in the year following completion of the course. Since 2000 graduations have been held in December of the year of completion and in July-August.

How to use this publication (*cont*)

Section 3

Chronological List of all Roseworthy Graduates from 1886 to 2005

This is to be used to establish the following:

1. Year of graduation with names presented alphabetically in each year regardless of course completed.
2. Qualification achieved.
3. Ranking within the completed course from 1886 to 1967 when rankings ceased.
4. Honours when granted until 1965 as follows:
 - a. I represents First Class Honours;
 - b. II represents Second Class Honours;
 - c. III represents Third Class Honours;
 - d. Distinctions and Credits were awarded for some courses from 1986 to 1991 inclusive.
5. Awards presented by the Roseworthy Old Collegians Association Inc (ROCA) for academic achievements. These have been presented in varying courses which have changed over the years. Presentation of these awards may have occurred in the year following the year of graduation.

Section 4

Roseworthy Old Collegians Association Inc (ROCA) Award of Merit Recipients

The ROCA Award of Merit is the highest honour ROCA bestows on its members. Since 1961, forty seven notable Old Collegians have been honoured by the Association for meritorious and outstanding service to agriculture, the College, ROCA and the community. The Honour Board detailing past recipients is in the foyer of the Main Building adjacent to the Dining Room at Roseworthy.

These fact sheets have been compiled by Andrew Brown, a member of the Roseworthy subgroup of the University Archives Volunteer Group.
