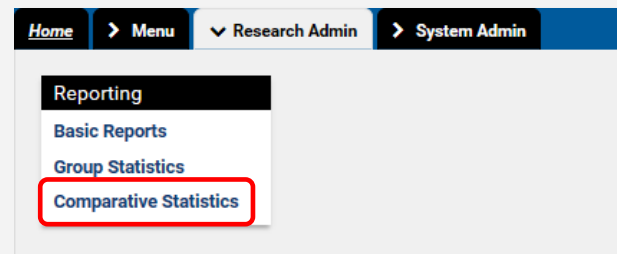


Comparative statistics


