- STARSS is the first large scale, publicly funded real-time vaccine safety surveillance study in Australia
- Notifications of patients having sought medical advice by SMS reach the STARSS system within 1 hour. All reports are investigated by our team and the GP is updated within 48 hours with the outcome of the assessment
- Eligibility to apply for 40 Category I QI-CPT points*
- Expand your understanding of the process of reporting adverse events following vaccination
- Being part of a network of practices conducting real-time surveillance
- Access to surveillance results for own practice vs other practices in SA, Vic and WA
- Nurses professional development opportunities:
 - Accredited Good Clinical Practice online course
 - Access to [Understanding Vaccines and the National Immunisation Program](#), SA Health's nurse immuniser education programme covering:
 - epidemiology of vaccine preventable diseases
