*What animals live in the Waite Arboretum, and where?*

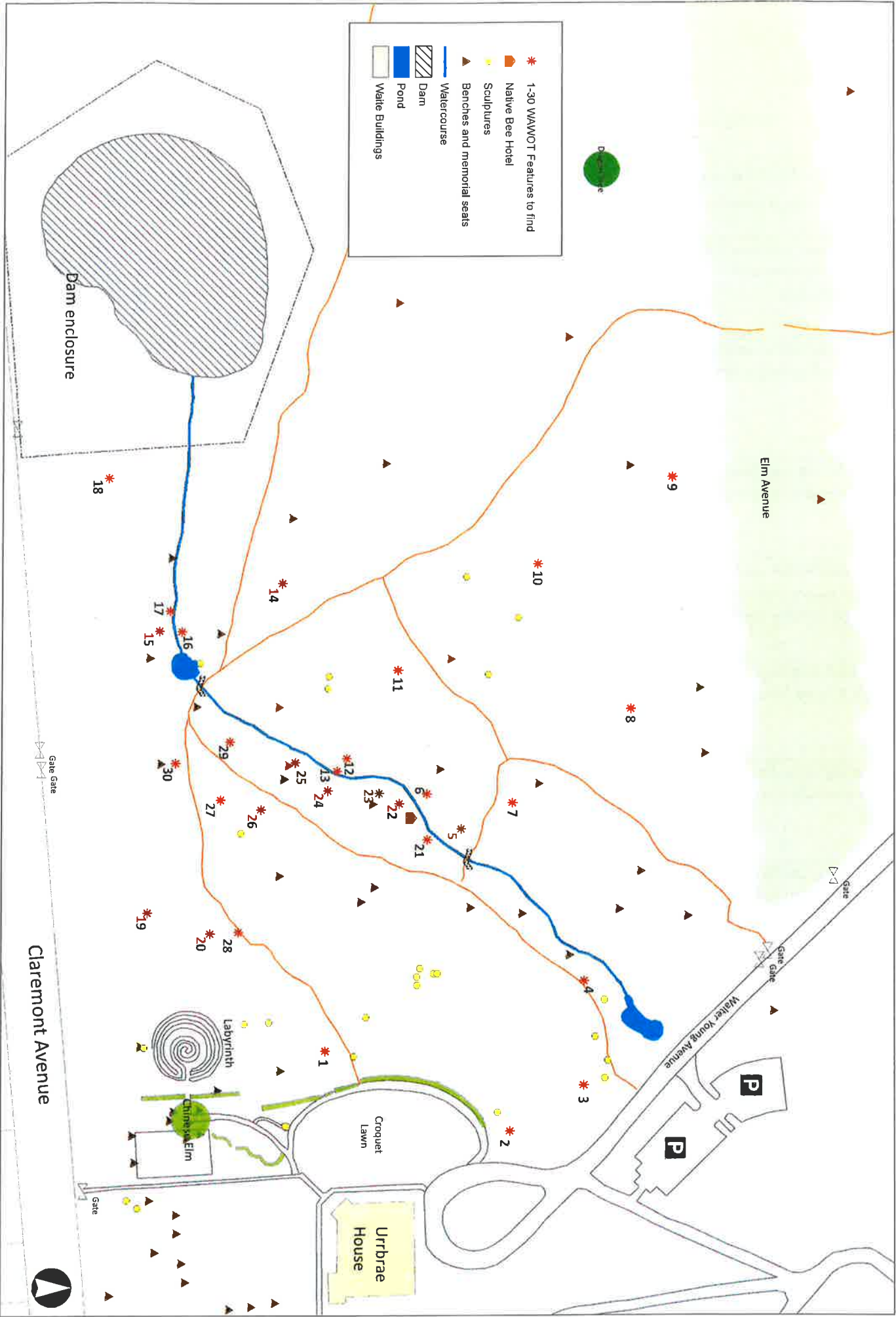
Come and explore our historic Arboretum to find all sorts of interesting things, from beetles and butterflies, to lizards, bats and koalas!

The Map overleaf has numbers where each of the creatures are living; see if you can work out what they are, and start your self-guided discovery of the wildlife found in the Waite Arboretum.
