
President's Report – A Tribute to Emeritus Professor John Prescott

I returned to Adelaide from overseas in late October to hear the sad news of John Prescott's death.


John's contribution to Urrbrae House was outstanding so it is fitting that I devote my newsletter report to a tribute to John.

There will be much written about the fields in which John excelled not least of these being his scientific career. Others are best qualified to write about that so I will confine my words to John's role as a Friend and a personal mentor to me.

John's memories of Urrbrae House and the Waite Institute go back to the mid 1920s when John came to the Waite as a child with his parents. His

When the project to establish and develop the historic precinct was started in the early 1990s under the leadership of the then Director, Professor Harold Woolhouse, John was an early supporter.

He was a marvellous source of information about the house and the history of the Waite and was generous in giving time out of his very busy schedule to support and assist the development of the precinct. John served on the committee of the Friends of Urrbrae House with three years as President. His leadership was both dynamic and efficient. John and his wife Jo have been regular supporters of events held at the house, hardly ever missing a concert or social gathering. John's support has been expressed in a number of generous actions, some of which he was too modest to mention.

Beyond this John was a mentor and friend to me, particularly in my role as Manager of Urrbrae House from 1991 to 2008. I came to appreciate and value John's knowledge of the house, the Waite and more broadly the University. I could discuss

even the most sensitive issues with John and was always able to rely upon his wise advice and guidance as well as his discretion. There were a number of difficult times when John's willingness to speak up on behalf of Urrbrae House has greatly aided the continuity of our work.

Since my retirement John has encouraged me in projects to research and write about the two earliest Directors of the Waite. I am currently researching John's father, James Prescott and I am beginning to realise the environment of commitment, integrity and science in which John was raised and so reflected in his own approach. When this booklet is written I will have much pleasure in dedicating it to John.

I hope that the Friends of Urrbrae House can help establish some sort of a memorial to John's contribution in Urrbrae House. He will be sadly and deeply missed.
