From the President

A Blueprint for the Future

A belated 'Happy New Year' to all and a warm welcome to 2003!

We all share a passion for conserving and restoring the rare grassy woodland that graces the Waite CR. But how should we go about it? With dozens of problems constantly screaming for our attention, how do we decide which to give the highest priority? How can we target our efforts to ensure the best use of our scarce resources?

What is needed is a clear vision of just exactly what the goal of restoration efforts should be, and an agreed set of methods and principles to apply in pursuing that goal. With over ten years' experience in management of the reserve, and growing interest in the area from many stakeholders, it seems an opportune time to distil our collective wisdom into a plan of action that will both consolidate our many achievements to date, and act as a road map for the future.

To this end, the Waite CR Management Committee¹ is currently preparing a management plan for the reserve that will formalize the framework within which restoration activities by the FWCR and other volunteers can proceed.

Management plans can often turn out to be cumbersome documents full of vague motherhood statements that make great bookends but don't lead to much in the way of action. The committee has deliberately striven to avoid this trap and to make the plan concise, flexible and above all explicit in its recommendations for what works should be undertaken as a priority.

The plan will set out the objectives of reserve management, explicitly state the ecological principles to be adopted, list a prioritised set of management actions and maintain an archive of best-practice techniques. It will be updated at regular intervals to incorporate relevant suggestions, new developments in the theory and techniques of ecological restoration, and new management issues that arise. Expert advice will be solicited from affiliate advisors chosen for the relevance of their ecological expertise and history of association with the reserve. By posting the plan on the forthcoming reserve website, we aim to obtain constructive comments from a wide cross-section of interested parties and thus continue to refine and improve the plan.

Our hope is that by operating under an agreed set of principles that are constantly open to improvement, the management of the reserve will become more focused and efficient...and the precious environment we value so much will become more enjoyable than ever.

I never cease to be amazed at and grateful for the diversity of talent in our ranks, and the cheerful dedication that people show for the cause.
